Our parish Lent course this week is only two weeks long and will be repeated in each church. We have a video of Bishop Mark talking about what it means to be a disciple and what it means to be a missionary. The talks are down to earth and help us reflect in concrete ways what being a missionary disciple means for each of us in our everyday life. After watching a video each week there is an opportunity to discuss together and share our thoughts. The Lent course has been organised by Mark Mesley, of our parish, who, for many years, was an Anglican priest and is hoping to go to seminary this Autumn to prepare to be ordained as a Catholic priest.

Please come and share in these sessions if you can. **The first sessions are at Holy Family on Sunday 10 and 17 March, after Sunday Mass at about 10.15am in the hall committee room.**

Lock the Door

This is the opposite to our parish plan, but it does apply at when using the downstairs WC at Holy Redeemer. The bolt to lock the door needs pushing all the way home, i.e., so it can be turned through 90 degrees in the housing. If it is only pushed in half way it comes undone if anyone tries the door from outside. Practice and experiment the next time you are there and pass the message on.

Parish Development

The architects have visited Holy Family and St Paul's churches and have been briefed on the ideas that were shared in the development meetings in those churches. They are now carrying out feasibility studies for these ideas. This means they will come up with some initial designs to see how the ideas can be implemented, and look at initial costings to see if the finances work out. They are due to report back in about six weeks. When the reports are ready they will be presented by the architects to each church at open meetings, to which anyone will be welcome. At Holy Redeemer we had a positive visit from the Institute of Christ the King a couple of weeks ago. They were able to tell us that in the other places where they had gone they made provision for all the things we wanted to know about, such as English language mass and school use of the church. They have also been to visit other possible churches. As yet we have not heard anything back from them following their visit.

We will have a Holy Redeemer Development meeting at 6.00pm on Tuesday 12 March at St Budeaux Presbytery to share ideas and keep everyone up to date. All are welcome to attend.
