Development Meetings



The second round of meetings took place in each church last week. Thank you to all those who attended.

At the beginning of this planning year, all the meeting so far have concentrated on the development of the sites and the buildings rather than on community activities. The reason for this is to kick start whatever plans we have for the buildings in order to be able to further explore ideas with outside people, groups, and authorities, which always takes a long time. Once we have got this process started we then can get on with thinking about community developments as well.



At Holy Redeemer our concern is that the parish is not

financially sustainable with the church building as it is, both in terms of the repairs needed, and the maintenance and management which will be needed in the future on such a massive building. The overwhelming sense of the meetings was that the best way forward would be to use part of the building to improve the school facilities while using the rest as a smaller church. Over the next six weeks we will explore this idea with the education authorities and hopefully come back with an idea of how this can be done and funded.

At Holy Family and St Pauls

our concern was to think how the buildings could be more inviting to

all and welcoming especially to young families. We are going to ask an architect to come up with initial drawings and to carry out a feasibility study how we can create a welcoming area at the entrance to each church, together with other

elements listed on the noticeboards in each church, and to consider how we can use our other existing buildings to fund the developments and repairs. Again we expect this process to produce something for us to look at in six weeks.



We will therefore be meeting again in each church in the second week of March. The March meetings will be publicised nearer the time. Thank you again to all who managed to take part, and to all who make suggestions and comments at other times.
