Heating at Holy Redeemer

Good News: the failed pump will be taken out this Wednesday and a replacement put in on Friday, so we should have heating back on next Sunday.

It has taken so long to get this pump replaced partly because the size of the heating system at Holy Redeemer means only certain plumbers are licenced to work on it, and these plumbers are all busy just now, when government grants have to be spent before the end of the financial year; and partly because the system is so old that several licenced firms initially said they would do the job, but then realised it wasn't straightforward, and pulled out,

It does confirm however that we are right to grasp the nettle of getting Holy Redeemer into a more sustainable condition. At the moment, just about anything that goes wrong with the building as it is, would be difficult to get repaired; and would also be expensive. (The cost of replacing this one pump is over £2,000, when the equivalent for a modern system such as we have in the other two churches would be around £200).

We are making progress. Outline ideas shared at the last Development meeting can be found at the back of each church, and these were presented to the architects last week for them to carry out feasibility studies.

Installation of Canons

Two new canons will be installed at the Cathedral on Monday next week: Fr Mark O'Keeffe and Fr Peter Morgan. Fr Phillip Dyson will be installed as an honorary canon.

The installation will be at 6.15pm, which will be followed by mass.

Everyone is welcome to join the Cathedral Chapter in celebrating the installation and the mass which will follow it.
