Parish Visitation

Our bishop is coming to make an official visitation of our parish on November 16th and 17th.

During every official visitation there is always the opportunity for any parishioner to meet with the bishop privately and raise any matter they wish with him. This is a way of the bishop being able to hear directly about anything which needs to be heard.

Safeguarding Rep

We are still trying to find a volunteer to be the nominated person for safeguarding at Saint Pauls.

If you think you can help, talk to Kathy Turvey or Pat Morris to find out what it involves. Most of the time it is just being the person children know they can safely go to, if they are worried about how someone is behaving towards them.

Thankfully this doesn't happen often, but if it ever did, we need to know that we have a kind and competent person who is there to listen and help them.

Buildings Update

The work to renew Holy Family roof is progressing well despite the bad weather. The new roof will be guaranteed for 20 years, and it is expected to last 30 or 40 years.

The heating pump at Holy Redeemer has been replaced, but we have found that there is a leak in the system., which may have been the cause of the previous pump failing. This means the radiators cannot hold water because the water is flowing out somewhere, so the heating is not working this week. As there are no signs of leaks, and it is a big leak (more than 100 gallons of water have been put in and it is still empty) it must be leaking in one of the short sections where the pipe runs under the floor. We will get the plumber to put in some new pipe to replace these sections and hopefully that will mean the heating will be back on soon

Those who count the collection will make sure the mass is arranged. If you put your contact details on the envelope, you will be contacted to tell you the date the mass has been scheduled for.
