## Safeguarding Rep

## Ill or going into hospital

If you are seriously ill at home or go into hospital, remember to let the priest know so that you can receive the sacrament of the sick (anointing). We all need to know that it is simply the case that the hospital do not tell the priest when a catholic is in hospital any more or even tell the hospital chaplain. They only do this when a patient asks them to do so, so please ask.

Offering the sacrifice of the mass is the central prayer of the catholic church. All masses are offered for the whole world, and for all people, living and dead; but at each mass, the priest has a specific intention for which he particularly offers that mass.
